



North Mymms Parish Council

The Parish Council was established in 1894 by an Act of Parliament which created civil parishes separated from the church. North Mymms parish is one of the largest in Hertfordshire its main source of income is a precept which is part of your Council Tax. Other income is derived from hiring out the bowling green, football field etc.

Parish councils have legal powers as defined in various Acts, but they have fewer duties than district councils and greater freedom to choose what actions to take. They represent the interests of the local communities and seek to improve the quality of life and local environment, influencing decisions and delivering services to meet local needs.

North Mymms is a relatively large parish as it covers 1892.77 hectares and in the 2011 census the number of 'usual residents' was 8921.

North Mymms parish includes Brookmans Park, Welham Green, Bell Bar, Water End, Bullens Green, Marshmoor, North Mymms and part of Little Heath. The full council usually meets at 7.30pm on the last Wednesday of each month except August and December. All meetings are open to the public.

At least one councillor represents NMPC on various committees such as the North Mymms Memorial Hall committee.

NMPC employs a part-time Clerk, a part-time Bookkeeper, and three Groundsmen. The Groundsmen tend the three recreation grounds at Hawkshead Road Little Heath, Gobions Open Space and Dellsome Lane, Welham Green. The latter includes a bowling green, football pitch and the Burns Pavilion, and all three contain children's play areas and the village green at Brookmans Park. The council owns these areas of land together with some allotments, two bungalows (for staff accommodation) and the council office, all at Welham Green. The council also tends around the War Memorial.

No book to swap, no worries, you can buy books at a special price, maximum of 3 books can be swapped or purchased at any one time.

We have a stock of at least a 1000 hard & soft backed books, fiction, reference; you name it, we will possibly have it. Why not come and look.

We have a good range of books for children.

We are not a library so we cannot order books for you, nor can we deliver. A Herts CC library is situated at Bradmore Green Brookmans Park. We rely 100% on volunteers and the North Mymms Memorial Hall to provide the rooms which are funded by the North Mymms Parish Council.

Any running costs we must raise ourselves.

The North Mymms Memorial Hall

The Hall was built in 1957 by public subscription and it is named in memory of the men of the Parish who died in the two World Wars. At the time of its construction the Parish had used an ex-army WW1 hut as a Village Hall, a replacement was urgently needed so, in spite of the restrictions at the time, land was given and the money raised.

The original purpose of the Hall has remained true over the years and still today is the focal point in the Parish for meetings, events and entertainment, with weekday classes for fitness, dancing and special interest groups.

It has one of the finest sprung dance floors in the district. The Hall is a registered charity and raises its own funds for maintenance and day to day running costs.
